

Honoring Black History Month



We are celebrating Black History Month by offering a special program on February 15th. Titled "From Slavery to Freedom and Underground Railroad Sites", this free presentation will be at the Barn at Stratford.

2690 Stratford Road, Delaware, beginning at 7 pm.

Attendees will learn about the history of Africa Road, the Underground Railroad, the Lucy Depp Settlement, the Alum Creek Quaker abolitionists, and more.

This program is presented by DCHS Volunteer, Watson Walker, Jr., who graduated with a B.A. from Fisk University and an M.A. from the University of Dayton. He has been a member of the Delaware County Genealogical Society since 2007 and currently serves as their president. Watson has been a member of the Delaware County Historical Society since 2007 and serves as the Chair of the DCHS Diversity and Inclusion Committee. He has authored three books on the Underground Railroad and six volumes of "dime novels" - Black History.
