Using recorded music, presenter William T. McDaniel, Jr., PhD., will explore various aspects and periods of black history by examining the music of each era, ranging from the work songs and spirituals of slavery through the rap of modern urban times. Nash House Exhibit - Open Now through April 30 "Satin and Steel: Busting Myths and

Demystifying Historical Undergarments"

The exhibit explores a more intimate side of history, featuring a sampling of women's under garments from the DCHS collection and their evolution throughout the century from 1870s – 1970s. From bustles, corsets and petticoats to a colorful collection of 1920s lingerie, visitors will have the opportunity to view a variety of intimate apparel and understand their place in history, along with Delaware's own contributions as a manufacturer from the **Delaware Underwear Company** (later Delaware Garment Company) - known locally as "the panty factory."

The Nash House Museum is open to the public every Wednesday (10:00 AM - 5:00 PM, closed from noon - 1:00 PM for lunch) and Sunday (2:00 -5:00 PM) or by appointment. Donations are welcome and encouraged and will further the Delaware County Historical Society's mission.
