Cultural Communities: Early Settlers & American Indians 1770-1850 Grades 5 thru 11



Hear the stories of our early settlers and American Indians. How did they live together in our county while maintaining their cultural differences?

Vignettes include the words of Laura Carpenter, William Little, Reverend James Finley, Dolly Byxbe, Benjamin Franklin Thomas, stories about Africa, Ohio, Drake's Defeat, American Indian games and dances inspired by the traditions of the Lenni Lenape.
