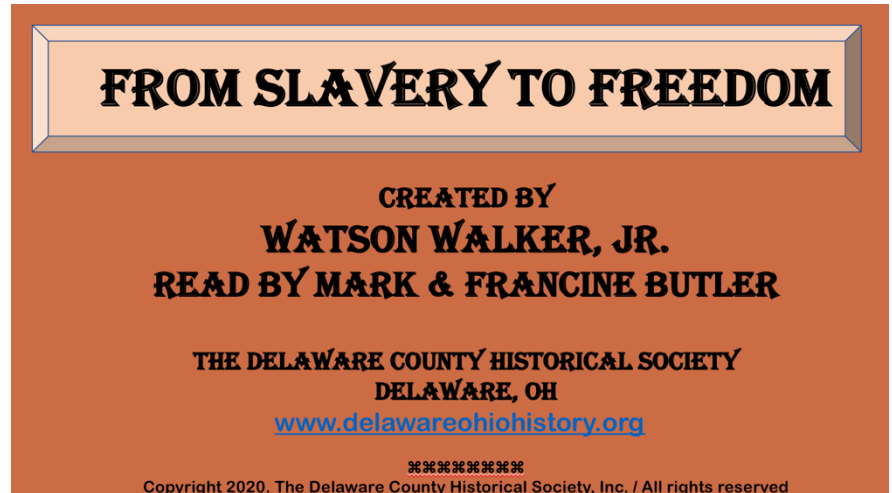


From Slavery to Freedom
