The Impact of Delaware County's Indigenous Peoples 1st – 4th grades







A visit with the American Indian Tribes in Delaware

Three early Delaware County settlers go into the classroom and describe and share their lives among the Wyandot and Lenni Lenape (Delaware) tribes during the early development of Delaware County. The first early settler describes his life at this time and how he interacts with the indigenous people. Next, 'Laura Carpenter' reenacts the brush she has with the indigenous people as an early Liberty Township settler. Or the teacher may choose "Dolly Byxbe" (the wife of Delaware County's founder, Moses Byxbe) who observed the Lenni Lenape as they were led through Delaware on their exile march from the Muskingum River to Piqua, Ohio, during the War of 1812.

The final early settler provides an activity demonstrating techniques used in farming and setting up a homestead, such as corn-grinding and "The Three Sisters" companion planting method.

Location:

We will bring this program to your school, organization or venue.

Length of time:

The program is 30 to 60 minutes depending on the schedule that best meets your needs and grade level.

Fee:

Our program fee is \$50.00 for small groups (up to 50 people), or \$100.00 for larger groups (50+) and increments of \$50 for each group of 50 participants.
