Tour of the Nash House

Join us at the beautiful Nash House that was built in 1878 by the Slattery family. Learn about the Slattery family and three generations of the Nash family who lived in this home. Period artifacts and furniture fill this lovely home which gives visitors a look back at what it was like to live in this home in the late 1800's and early 1900's. Note: the upstairs of the Nash House is not handicapped accessible because of the narrow stairway but a video is available to be viewed downstairs as needed.

Location:

Nash House/ Delaware County Historical Society, 157 E. William Street on the corner of East William Street and Little Street.
